OUR MILITARY MEN

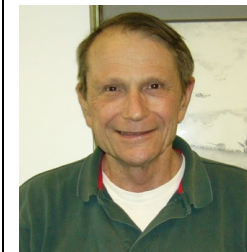

The grandfather of four, Harry resides in Santa Barbara, CA. with his present wife, Jean.

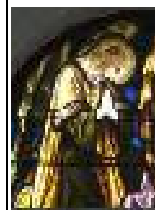
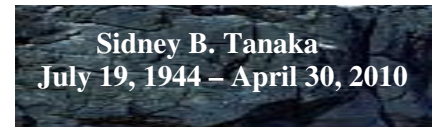
SALTY CLUB
